

UCAS Top 10 tips for your daughter or son

- 1 [Start research early](#) – there are a lot of higher education options to choose from!
- 2 [Know the deadlines](#) – for some courses, the application deadline is almost a year in advance of when the course starts.
- 3 [Browse through courses](#) – so they can work out what they would enjoy or be interested in.
- 4 [Go to UCAS events and course provider open days](#) – speak to us and higher education staff to get answers to their questions.
- 5 [Check entry requirements](#) – make sure they can get the grades they need to get a place on a course.
- 6 [Redraft their personal statement](#) – get plenty of feedback and refine it until they're happy.
- 7 [Understand student finance](#) – so they can make the best arrangements to fund their studies. Full-time undergraduate students starting their studies from 1 August 2016 will be eligible for a means tested maintenance loan of up to £8,200, to help with students' living costs. This loan will be paid back in the same way as a tuition fee loan, once they've graduated or finished their studies, and are earning over £21,000 a year. Previously, this loan would have taken the form of a non-repayable grant. The maintenance loan is based on your household income, with the maximum loan available if this is less than £25,000. - 8 [Be prepared for results day](#) – make sure they're prepared for all the possible outcomes.
- 9 Understand how [Extra](#) and [Clearing](#) work – different ways to apply for more courses.

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Life After Bullers

What is UCAS?

- UCAS is the University/College Admissions Service
- It is the only way of applying and securing a place at a UK university or college
- You apply online through “UCAS Apply”



UCAS Application Process

Register with UCAS and start application using buzzword 'yearthirteen2018'.
Summer term

Personal statement workshop? **18th July 2017**

Write personal statement, print a draft and hand in to form tutor to review **by Thursday 20th July**

Make suggested changes to your statement, then complete your application on the UCAS website. Print form and hand in to tutor for checking **by Friday 15th September.**

Make suggested changes, and 'Pay and send' application on UCAS. (This does not send it to UCAS, but means that it is ready for the next steps.) Print a new copy and place in the IN tray D7 for review by nominated sixth form team member. **Applications should be submitted to sixth form team between 25 September and Friday 20 October.**

Sixth form team member will check form and meet with you to discuss your application and suggest further changes. **You need to allow at least two weeks for this checking and amending process so it is essential that completed forms are passed to sixth form team in good time.**


Once your 6th form lead is happy with the application, it will go to Mrs Oliver for final checking. There are likely to be some further edits at this stage so keep checking your emails.

Once these final amendments made, Mrs Oliver will send your application to UCAS. **Applications must be submitted to sixth form team by 1 December 2017, otherwise they are unlikely to be processed in time for the UCAS deadline of 15 January 2018**

Once the application has been submitted, UCAS will send you a new login ID which will allow for tracking of your application.

How does it work?

- Students complete online the UCAS form that contains 4 vital pieces of information:
- Personal details (DOB, address, GCSE and AS results etc.) *All grades have to be declared even 'U' grades. Some Universities request module results.*
- 5 choices of university
- A personal statement
- An academic school reference



Your Five Choices

- You need to have selected up to 5 *similar* course choices
- Check and double check that the course is for you and that you meet the standard entry requirements
- Go and visit your choices - get the prospectus
- Research the location

Degree & Higher apprenticeships

Degree apprenticeships – university fees paid for via the Apprenticeship Levy or by the employer (who can then claim it back from the Gov).

Exeter, Bristol, Warwick, Aston, Sheffield Hallam and West of England universities currently involved, with more coming on board this year including Anglia Ruskin, Coventry, Lancaster, Liverpool John Moores, Loughborough, Manchester Met, Northumbria, Nottingham Trent, Queen Mary, Essex, East London and Greenwich



Sponsored degrees/school leaver programme

You are contracted to work for the company after you graduate, so make sure you're happy before you commit

School leaver programmes –now marketed as THE alternative to university for high achieving, ambitious students – similar to higher apprenticeships



Companies offer sponsored degrees where you might work full time and study part time OR study full time and combine with work experience

School leaver programmes can combine work experience with intensive training and the chance to gain a professional qualification or undergraduate degree



Advantages of apprenticeships/school leaving schemes

Degree/training paid for by employer

Could be a quicker route than university for some careers

Building skills and networks that employers want

Don't have to miss out on a social life – many employers offer trainee nights out/social events similar to those put on by universities

Some employers will also offer help with accommodation if you are moving away from home (again not too different from uni!).

Earning and learning at the same time

Interested in apprenticeships/school leaving schemes?

Act now! Start to research companies you are interested in

Create an action plan – which companies are you going to apply to? When are their deadlines?

Follow companies on social media to be given updates on job opportunities

Keep track of applications – heard back yet? Offered interview? Rejected?

Prepare for interviews/selection days – what do you understand about the company and job you are applying for?

Keep track of universities – many are advertising higher and degree apprenticeships too.

Gap Year – what can you do?

Gap year pros and cons


Advantages of a gap year:

- Become better prepared for the world of work or university
- Could earn money before entering university or employment
- Chance to experience life away from home
- Opportunity to help others
- Fantastic work experience employers find valuable
- Pick up new skills and become more confident
- Maybe last chance to have long holiday before going into work or further study


Disadvantages of a gap year:

- Can be costly – especially travelling abroad or being part of an organised gap year
- If you are not organised you could spend your gap year doing nothing – not great for your CV or uni application!
- If you haven't deferred a university offer you could risk losing it or might not go to university.
- Friends may have moved on and you could be a year behind them.






