What is the structure of the day?

The day starts for all students at 8.30am and ends at 3.00pm. Here you can see the school day for Year 7s:

What is the school uniform?

What languages will my daughter study?

All students will study Spanish and French.

Where do students get lunch?

We have three places where students can buy lunch—the dining hall, the Dalo building and the Food Cube (an outdoor seating area with covered seating). Students can also bring a packed lunch and we have picnic tables throughout the site.

What are the extra-curricular activities on offer?

We offer a wide range of extra-curricular activities with a number of sports and musical activities as well as Drama, Poetry, History, Maths and much more. You can find our extra-curricular activities for 2022-2023 <u>HERE</u> though some activities may be added throughout the year so please check regularly.

How much homework do Year 7 students get?

Students are regularly set homework in all of their subjects. In year 7, students can expect to spend 1 to $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours on homework each evening.

How is the homework set?

We use Show My Homework. Your daughter will receive a login and password for this.

How does the school help new students settle into Year 7?

In the summer term of Year 6 your daughter will be invited to spend an Induction Day with us so she can spend time in the school with her form and year group peers.

Parents and Carers are also invited to an information evening so they can meet key members of staff. We also run a highly successful Summer School during the summer break before Year 7 start.

In September, our caring and empathetic pastoral team works hard to get to know each individual student and help them become accustomed to life at Bullers Wood School for Girls.

What is the Schoolgateway and how do I access it?

The Schoolgateway is the platform we use for parents and carers to report student absences, pay for trips, school dinners etc.

Frequently Asked Questions ...

How are students with SEND supported?

Teachers are aware of students with additional educational needs and liaise with the school's Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator (SENDCO), Learning Support Assistants and Heads of Year to ensure that they feel fully supported.

Teachers differentiate their lessons for the whole range of abilities and to accommodate specific learning needs.

Some students may have an Educational Health Care Plan and will receive additional interventions from the SEND department including speech and language therapy or individual and small group interventions.

What is student behaviour like?

Student behaviour is excellent and it is the expectation of every member of staff that the behaviour of students within our community at Bullers Wood School will be of a very high standard at all times.

Behaviour management is a collective responsibility, all staff contribute to maintaining a positive atmosphere (in lessons and around site) based on the shared core values of mutual respect and ready to learn. We aim to build positive relationships, which establish an ethos of Behaviour for Learning where learning is sacrosanct with consequences for any behaviour that disrupts this process. Our Behaviour Policy can be found <u>HERE</u>.

How is pastoral care organised?

Form tutors are the first port of call in our pastoral care system and students stay with form groups from years 7 to 11 where possible. Heads of Year oversee year groups and are involved when students have more serious issues.

Each year group also has an Assistant Headteacher supporting and looking after them. Our Designated Safeguarding Lead, Mrs German, and the safeguarding team ensure that students are kept safe in school. We also have School Counsellors that students can see if they need someone to talk too.

The school has a House system which enables collaboration across the year groups and competition between houses, to develop school community spirit. Each house is named after an inspirational woman:

Attendance and Punctuality

An excellent attendance record is essential for students to be able to perform to the best of their ability at school. The school's Attendance and Punctuality Policy can be located <u>HERE</u>.

If a student has to stay at home because of ILLNESS, please follow these steps:

- Please contact the school before 8.30am each day of absence using the School Gateway App. If you are unable to use the app, please email the school office at <u>office@bwsgirls.org</u>.
- Where an absence exceeds 5 calendar days due to illness, (excluding the weekend) you will be expected to provide medical evidence from a doctor (appointment cards, prescriptions, letters or a medical certificate) to the school. Medical evidence may be requested if there are regular absences from school due to illness.

Truancy

If a student is absent from school without permission and a covering letter, this will be identified as truancy and appear as such on school records and reports. The student will incur a sanction for this.

Medical and Dental Appointments

Unless genuinely unavoidable, medical and dental appointments should be arranged **OUTSIDE** school time. If a student will be arriving late due to an appointment, a parent/carer must contact the school via the Schoolgateway app or send an email to office@bwsgirls.org by **8.30am**.

As soon as the student arrives at school, they should sign in at the School Office (B9) and provide the reason (and evidence of appointment as necessary).

Occasionally an appointment will require a student to leave school early. Students must provide evidence of all appointments (e.g. appointment card issued by the surgery), and show the evidence of their appointment to the School Office to update our attendance records accordingly.

If your child needs to leave school early, they must be collected by a parent/carer from the School Office.

In exceptional circumstances only, if you are unable to collect your child, you should write a note in their contact book to explain the arrangements made and to confirm that you are happy for them to leave school unaccompanied. The student must show this note to their Head of Year to authorise the arrangement. They may then go to the School Office when they need to leave and show the note, with the Head of Year authorisation.

Medical Room

If your child regularly suffers with ailments such as headaches or any other pain/discomfort, we can only provide medication you have sent in for your child.

In those instances, we kindly request you complete our online form: <u>Consent-for-Medication</u> and return it to Miss Y Vasileva (yvasileva@bwsgirls.org).

We will not provide pain relief medication to any student unless we have a completed form and the medication provided with their name on.

If your child is unwell at school and requires pain relief, we will contact you and ask you to either collect your child or ask you to bring some medication to school for them.

School Trips and Visits

Day visits and residential trips are an extremely important part of education and development. All students will have the opportunity to take part in visits and trips both of an educational and of a recreational nature.

Attendance and Behaviour will be a consideration when inviting students to participate in trips and visits.

Please note, the school reserves the right not to accept students whose behaviour is a cause of concern.

Family holidays

Holidays must not be arranged during school time because it disrupts work, progress and achievement (it can also create social difficulties).

Family holidays during school time will not be authorised. To request an absence please contact your child's Head of Year in the first instance.

Punctuality

Students must be in school by 8.25am and in their **Period 1 room before 8.30am**. Any students who are late will sit a half hour detention on the following day. Students arriving late to school <u>must</u> report to the School Office to sign in.



Uniform is important to us at Bullers Wood, and students in Years 7 to 11 are expected to wear the correct uniform at all times.

Friends of Bullers Wood maintain a stock of high quality used uniform that are available to purchase at set points in the school year.

All items must be clearly labelled with the student's name.

Uniform List

• School regulation navy blazer* (Compulsory for Years 7-10 from September 2023, optional for Year 11

• Navy V-neck pullover or cardigan with the School Badge* (optional for students with blazers; compulsory for those without)

• 'A' line Black Watch tartan skirt with inverted pleats, knee length or below*

- Full length navy trousers with the School Badge*
- Cream blouse*

• Navy or black below knee length or short socks, or plain navy or black tights. Leggings or patterned tights are not permitted. Socks may not be worn over tights.

• Black, sensible, low-heeled, traditional shoes. No trainers, canvas shoes, open-toes, flip flops, sling-backs or casual style footwear.

• Black or Navy plain, fabric coat with long sleeves. No hoodies or sweatshirt style jackets with hoods. (Large logos, denim, leather, suede, PVC and fur coats/jackets are not allowed)

• Black Watch tartan scarf or plain scarf/hat (optional) in any of the school colours (ie. cream/ white/navy/dark green/red/black). This may not be worn in lessons

• A strong, waterproof plain black school bag, large enough for A4 books and files

• Apron for Home Economics – navy with white stripe (can be purchased through the HE department payable via the School Gateway, or from Bromley Schoolwear)*

White Science laboratory coat*

Items marked with an * can be purchased from Bromley Schoolwear (details over the page).

PE Kit

For PE, all students need:

- School polo shirt
- School shorts or leggings
- School full zip training top
- Navy knee length socks

• Sports trainers – no Converse/Vans/pumps (can be purchased from any sports shop)

• Mouthguards and shinpads for hockey, rugby or football lessons

• Football boots with British Safety Standard studs when taking part in hockey, rugby and football

• A PE bag (any colour)

Other optional items are also available, including a thermal base layer and a netball skort.

PE Kit is available from SWI Schoolwear (details on page 7).

To order online, simply visit the website and register a new account. New customers are asked to follow the online instructions to link their account to Bullers Wood School.

PE Kit products are displayed, with an indication of whether the product is compulsory or optional.

Items may be delivered to your home or to Bullers Wood School.

Jewellery, Make-Up, Nails, Hair, Eyelashes and Eyebrows

Jewellery is **NOT** part of school uniform. The only items permitted are:

• one pair of <u>small, plain silver or gold</u> stud earrings for pierced ears.

(one earring in each lower ear lobe) and/or

• a small chain with a religious symbol, if appropriate.

• a watch (which is encouraged).

Other body jewellery, including any form of facial, helix or body piercing (other than earrings in the lower ear lobe) are not permitted. Students must not cover piercings or use spacers.

Make up of any description SHOULD NOT be worn. Students will be asked to remove make up with wipes or wash it off in the cloakrooms.

Eyelashes and eyebrows should be of natural appearance, false eyelashes should not be worn.

Nail varnish, false nails or gel/acrylic nails are not permitted.

Hair accessories should be of school colours – cream, white, navy, dark green, red or black. No large flamboyant hair accessories. Hair should be of a natural colour and appearance. No extreme hair styles.

Equipment for School

Students are expected to come to school every day ready to learn with the basic equipment needed for lessons:

- Books for the school day
- Contact book
- Pencil case
- Blue or black pen for classwork
- Red pen for marking
- Pencils, including colouring pencils
- Ruler
- Protractor
- Eraser
- Compasses
- Scissors
- Glue

- Calculator (Casio Fx-85 GTX recommended)
- Dry Wipe pen

Lost Property and Valuables

Valuables must not be brought into school; however, those that are remain the sole responsibility of the student and not the school.

Bullers Wood School will not accept liability for any claim arising from theft, accidental loss or damage to personal effects, money, belongings or clothing whilst in school.

<u>Please make sure that all items of uniform, PE kit</u> and stationery are clearly named.

Lost property is held by Student Services (B9). Any lost property that is unnamed and unclaimed by the end of each half term is sold or disposed of.

Mobile Devices

In order to minimise classroom disruption, to prevent cyber bullying and the student use of inappropriate websites, the school does not allow students in Years 7-11 to use personal mobile devices in school, including air pods, headphones, mobile phones and iPhones.

If students choose to bring mobile devices/ear/ headphones into school, they must remain switched off whilst on site. These items must be stored out of sight in students' bags.

Please note that we cannot accept responsibility for valuable items that are lost or stolen.

Should a student be seen with a mobile device/ear/ headphones on the premises, it will be confiscated until the end of half-term or until the student's parent/ carer makes an appointment to come in and collect it. If a student needs to contact home in an emergency, they can speak to their Form Tutor, Head of Year or Student Services.

We want Bullers Wood School to be a safe place where students can enjoy their learning in a peaceful and calm environment. Therefore, we would be grateful for your support with this.

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Health and Safety in PE

The PE Department has carried out a Risk Assessment to cover safe practice during Physical Education.

Protective Wear

It is highly recommended by the Association for Physical Education that players should wear protective items such as mouthguards and shin pads as well as footwear appropriate for the surface when taking part in particular activities such as hockey and football. We would advise mouthguards and shin pads to be compulsory!

The PE department policy is that all students, as part of their PE Kit, should wear studded footwear (football boots with British Safety Standard studs), mouthguards and shin pads for their hockey, football and rugby lessons. Parents and carers may purchase mouthguards and shin pads from a reputable retailer. <u>Bullers Wood School for Girls accepts no</u> <u>responsibility for injuries incurred by a student</u> <u>due to the lack of protective equipment.</u>

<u>PE Kit</u>

Parents and carers are asked to ensure that their child has the correct Bullers Wood PE kit for all lessons including sports trainers that have good foot and ankle support and grip – **not** Converse, Vans or plimsolls. It is the students' responsibility to bring with them the appropriate equipment for every PE lesson, match etc.

<u>Jewellery</u>

All jewellery needs to be removed for every PE lesson.

Activities

Students will take part in a wide range of sports, such as trampolining, football, gymnastics, netball, athletics and many others.

It is essential that students follow instructions given by staff to ensure their safety. Parents and carers are asked to write to the Head of PE, care of office@bwsgirls.org, if their child has any medical conditions that may need to be considered. Where necessary, reasonable adjustments will be made to enable all students to access the PE curriculum.

Extra-curricular clubs

At Bullers Wood School for Girls students have the opportunity to participate in our extensive extracurricular programme. Students will be notified of the days and times when these activities take place.

Some activities take place after school, and students are dismissed from an after school activity to make their own way home. Students being collected may wait on site, by the food cube, if their parent or carer is delayed.

Please note there is no vehicular access after 4.30pm so students waiting on site at this time should walk out to meet their parents or carers when they have arrived.

School competitive matches, competitions or tournaments

Bullers Wood School for Girls students regularly participate in borough, county and regional competitions. Students attending extra-curricular activities may be selected to participate in these competitions, which may take place during the school day. Travel to and from these competitions is by school minibus. If a parent or carer does not wish their child to travel with staff in the school minibus they must contact the school and speak to the team manager in charge of the school team.

Students will be dismissed by staff from the school minibus, and students are then responsible for making their own way home. Students being collected may wait on site, as above.



Cashless Catering

At Bullers Wood School we use a cashless system for purchasing snacks and lunch – cash is not accepted at the food counter. Cashless catering enables us to deliver a more efficient, faster service and to continue to provide wholesome, healthy, and enjoyable meals at the lowest cost.

Money can be paid into your online account held within the system; money spent on food will be taken out of the system and you can always check the balance on-line. Once the selected food items have been entered into the system from an itemised keyboard in the canteen, the amount spent and the new cash balance will show on the display.

You will be able to get detailed information on each item of food served, each credit made to the system and a current balance via your account.

What is a Cashless System?

At the heart of the cashless system there is a computer controlled by IMPACT software. This allows the system to recognise each individual student, hold individual cash balances, record cash spent and cash received, record where money is spent, on what food, on any specific date and time of day.

Main Benefits of the Cashless Catering System

• Convenient way of paying for school meals. No more looking for change every morning.

• Discourages the misuse of school dinner money through spending in shops outside of the school grounds.

- Alleviates many of the associated problems with the use of cash in schools ie. loss, theft or bullying.
- Specific food allergy ingredients can be barred automatically.
- Healthy eating is encouraged.
- Queuing times are reduced through increased speed of service.

• Automatic Free School Meal allocation with the student remaining anonymous.

• Detailed reports to analyse all aspects of the use of the system.

• Students using the IMPACT system teaches important life skills.

• A more efficient delivery of service will help the catering team to provide wholesome, healthy and enjoyable school meals at a low cost.

How are students recognised by the system?

Each student will have their finger registered, which will then be translated into an alpha numeric number, the image is then discarded. The student simply places their finger on a scanner at the point of sale; a display will show the server the student's name, class and current cash balance held within the system. The selected food items will be entered into the system from an itemised keyboard while the amount spent and the new cash balance will appear on the display.

How is money entered into the system?

By a payment made on the Internet through an account set up in Schoolgateway. We advise parents to check their daughter's accounts on a regular basis to ensure sufficient funds are available. Full details as to how to set up your Schoolgateway account will be given to you shortly.

How will the student be able to check what the current cash balance is held in the system at any one time?

- The balance will be shown online.
- A display at the point of sale will show the new cash balance every time food is purchased.

What if the student does not hold a sufficient cash balance one day to pay for a school dinner?

In addition to parents and carers checking their daughter's balance regularly, your daughter will be able to see her balance each time she purchases food from the School Canteen. To further ensure students have sufficient funds on the Dinner Money account, parents and carers who have downloaded the Schoolgateway App will receive an automatic App notification alerting them when the balance on their daughter's Dinner Money account has reached below £5.00 and needs to be topped up. To receive the App notifications, parents must be signed in to Schoolgateway.

Our school records will show how much each parent and carer has paid and the appropriate account will be credited with the amount on the same day. For example, if a parent tops up their daughter's Dinner Money account, the funds will be available within 10 minutes of the payment for your child to purchase food in the School Canteen.



Cashless Catering continued ...

Students with insufficient funds to purchase food from the School Canteen will be able to contact you (using the phone at Student Services) to either top up the Dinner Money account or to bring in a packed lunch.

If your child does not purchase food from the School Canteen, i.e. brings in a packed lunch, or if your child qualifies for free school meals, please ignore the automatic notifications. It may, however, be worth considering topping up her Dinner Money account with a small amount just in case she forgets her packed lunch one day.

What about students entitled to a 'free school meal'?

The system works exactly the same for all students whether they pay or have a free school meal. All students have their own account to use in exactly the same way. The amount allocated for the free school meal will be entered into the system by the software each day and will be accessible at break and lunch time.

The system will then allow (on a daily basis) the required cash amount for each individual student to be allotted to their current cash balance. However, any under spend or missed meals will be identified by the system and will not be added to the next day's balance.

The student can also add extra cash on to her balance in the system, in the same way as other students to enable a greater daily spend on the school lunch or at break times than allocated by their free meal allowance. Students will not need a school pass for free school meals as all information will have been loaded electronically.

Will students have problems in using this system? Some students may find it difficult to control their accounts for the first couple of weeks, most learn this important life skill very quickly and will enjoy being in control of their account.

Data Handling

Certain data will be held on the system to enable accurate operation. This will include your child's name, class, photograph, account balance and meal entitlement. This data will be handled under the guidelines of the Data Protection Act and the Protection of Freedoms Act 2012 and will only used by parties directly involved with the implementation of the system.

Pupil Premium & Free School Meals

What is the Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium is a Government initiative that targets extra money at students from deprived backgrounds. Research demonstrates that students from deprived backgrounds underachieve compared to their non-deprived peers. The premium is provided in order to support these students to enable them to reach their full potential.

The Government has used students entitled to Free School Meals along with other identified vulnerable group data as an indicator of deprivation and have deployed a fixed amount of money to schools per student, over a rolling six year period.

The Pupil Premium is used to provide and implement a range of activities and strategies that ensures that Pupil Premium students receive direct support in order that they can thrive and succeed. The funding is discussed as part of the annual budget-setting process and the priorities are determined by the individual and group needs of students identified under the Pupil Premium.

How can I apply for Free School Meals/Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011 and is money allocated by the Government to schools for children of statutory school age who are eligible under the following criteria:

• Children who have registered for Free School Meals at any point in the last six years

• Children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months

• Children who have been adopted from care on or after 30th December 2006

• Children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces

All schools will receive money for every child that falls into one of these categories, and Bullers Wood will in turn use this money to improve facilities and the provision for students. If you feel your child is eligible under the last three criteria, please inform the school office as soon as possible, office@bwsgirls.org.



Pupil Premium & Free School Meals continued ...

You can register your child for Free School Meals if you receive or are eligible for any of these benefits:

- Income Support (IS)
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance (IBJSA)

• Income-related employment and support allowance (IRESA)

• Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income, as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs, that does not exceed £16,190

• Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit

• Where a parent is entitled to Working Tax Credit run-on (the payment someone receives for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)

• Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999.

• Universal Credit with an annual net earned income of no more than £7400 as assessed by earnings.

Registration is confidential and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming. Students can also register for free school meals if they receive any of these benefits themselves.

If you or your child prefers not to claim the free meals, your child can continue to have a packed lunch. However, it is important that you still register to ensure Bullers Wood School receives the funding.

For further information and to apply for Free School Meals, please access the Bromley Council Website <u>HERE</u>.

Please register as soon as possible. Once your application has been processed, the borough will write to you. The borough will also write to the school so we can ensure your child will receive a free school meal.

You may also receive help with the cost of school trips and visits. If you need any help with registration, please phone the borough on 020 8313 4127 or contact the school office at Bullers Wood School (office@bwsgirls.org).

Accountability – DFE Statement

The Government believes that head teachers and school leaders should decide how to use the pupil premium. They are held accountable for the decisions they make through:

Keeping Bullers Wood for Girls ahead



You will be aware that over the last 10 years public services in all sectors have faced significant financial challenges. Bullers Wood School, like others both locally and nationally, has in recent years faced sizeable budget reductions.
